This year we have crisscrossed the country working with organizations and communities to develop Family Justice Centers and multi-agency models focused on creating innovative, collaborative, trauma-informed approaches to meeting the needs of survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault and their children. We have trained professionals on documentation, investigation, and prosecution of near-fatal strangulation assaults through our nationally recognized Training Institute on Strangulation Prevention hosted hundreds of children at Camp HOPE America the first evidence-based camping and mentoring program for children impacted by domestic violence, engaged survivors with our VOICES Survivor Network and helped victims obtain civil legal services with our Justice Legal Network. - Held **international trainings** in Belgium, Japan, Columbia





