- 1. What is the purpose?
 - a. The purpose of a focus group is to understand how to better provide services to victims of domestic violence and to address the questions and concerns of potential community partners
- 2. How many people are needed in each group?
 - a. 10 minimum for both groups
 - b. You need to work with your local community agencies to identify survivors and make sure your potential community partners are available for the date and time you set.
- 3. How long does each group take?
 - a. We recommend allowing for 1-2 hours per group so that there is sufficient time for comments and discussion.
- 4. Will these focus groups be done privately and confidentially, or will the groups be conducted in front of the larger audience?
 - a. We recommend that focus groups be conducted in a private group setting so that survivors and other participants feel comfortable expressing their opinions.
 - b. Notes can be taken to summarize the responses for others.
 - c. Make every effort to protect the survivor's identity. Their names should not be identified in any report or publication.
- 5. Should survivors provide consent to participate? Are their responses confidential?
 - a. Yes, the Alliance encourages the use of signed consent prior to participating. Client should be informed how their responses will be used. See attached sample consent form.
- 6. What about survivors with children?
 - a. We suggest providing childcare or a separate playroom that parents can watch while participating
